Pastor: Bishop Samuel L. Green, Sr., I present these holy women to be consecrated deaconesses.

Bishop: Take heed that these women you present be proper persons to perform the work of a deaconess, and that they be of sober minds, modest in all their ways and possessed of large charity.

Pastor: They have been examined and are believed to be well qualified to enter upon the sacred duties of deaconesses.

Bishop: It becomes the deaconess that she shall be pious, chaste, temperate in all things, modest, humble, industrious, and devout, as she is to serve the Church of God and to His praise and glory. Throughout the history of the Church, God has been pleased to call and qualify certain women

for the gentle and holy service of ministering to the Church and the ministry. Such women were Deborah, Mary, the Holy Mother, Eunice, Lois, Priscilla, Lydia, and Phoebe. And in the latter days He has been pleased to own and bless the labors of Sister Sarah Gorham, Sister Rosa Parks and many others. May the Lord bless and acknowledge these persons according as He has blessed the ministration of all holy women. May they withdraw themselves from all worldly cares and vocations and give themselves up entirely to the ministrations of the Church and to suffering humanity.

Then shall the bishop inquire of the candidate(s) as follows:

Bishop: Have you duly considered the sacredness, the exactions and responsibilities of the office which you have come to enter?

Candidate: *I have considered them all.*

Bishop: Are you determined to observe all the rules for a deaconess, give yourself up to such life and duties as these rules require, and keep yourself unspotted from the world, and all its vanities and frivolities?

Candidate: *I am so determined.*

Bishop: Will you be governed by The Doctrine and Discipline of the African Methodist Episcopal Church and subject to the direction given in the discharge of the duties of your office?

Candidate: *I will be so governed.*

Then shall the person(s) to be consecrated kneel.

The bishop, taking each candidate by the hand, shall say to her:

Bishop: Be consecrated to the office and work of a deaconess in

the African Methodist Episcopal Church, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Then shall the Sponsor place the bonnet on the head of the candidate

THE ACT OF ORDINATION

The Call of Deacons (All deacon candidates will stand and come forth.)

Bishop: Do you trust that you are inwardly moved by the Holy Ghost to take upon you the office of the ministry in the Church of Christ, to serve God for the promotion of His glory, and the edifying of His people?

Candidates: *I trust so.*

Bishop: Do you unfeignedly believe all the canonical Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments?

Candidates: *I do believe them.*

Bishop: Will you diligently read and expound the same unto the people whom you shall be appointed to serve?

Candidates: *I will.*

Bishop: It appertains to the office of a Deacon to assist the Elder in Divine Service. And, especially when he/she administers the Holy Communion, to help him/her in the distribution thereof and to read and expound the Holy Scriptures; to instruct the youth, and in the absence of the Elder, to baptize and furthermore, it is his/her office to search for the sick, poor and impotent, that they may be visited and relieved. Will you do this gladly and willingly?

Candidates: *I will do so by the help of God.*

Bishop: Will you frame and fashion your own lives and the lives of your families according to the doctrine of Christ and to

make both yourselves and them, as much as in you lies, wholesome examples of the flock of Christ?

Candidates: *I will endeavor to do so, the Lord being my helper.*

Bishop: Will you reverently obey them to whom the charge and government over you is committed, following with a glad mind and with their godly admonition?

Candidates: *I will endeavor to do so, the Lord being my helper.*

THE IMPOSITION OF HANDS

(No more than 5 at the altar)

The Conference Secretary, reading the names of the Candidates.

Bishop: Take thou authority to execute the office of a Deacon in the Church of God in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen

Bishop: Take thou authority to read the Scriptures and to preach the same in the Church of God in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

THE CALL OF ELDERS

(All elder candidates will stand and come forth.)

Bishop: And now that this present congregation of Christ here assembled may also understand your minds and wills in these things, and that this your promise may the more move you to do your duties, you shall answer plainly to these things which we, in the name of God and his Church, shall demand of you, touching the same.

Bishop: Do you think in your heart that you are truly called, according to the will of our Lord Jesus Christ, to the order of elder?

Candidate: *I do so believe.*

Bishop: Are you persuaded that the Holy Scriptures contain sufficiently all doctrines required of necessity for eternal salvation through faith in Jesus Christ? Are you determined out of the said Scriptures to instruct the people committed to your charge, and teach nothing, as required of necessity to salvation, but that which you shall be persuaded may be conducted and proved by Scripture?

Candidate: *I am so persuaded and have so determined by God's grace.*

Bishop: Will you then give your faithful diligence always so to minister the Doctrine and sacraments and discipline of Christ as the Lord hath commanded?

Candidate: *I will do so, by the help of the Lord.*

Bishop: Will you be ready with all faithful diligence always to banish and drive away all erroneous and strange doctrines contrary to God's word, and to use both public and private monitions and exhortations as well to the sick as to the whole within your charge as need shall require and occasion shall be given?

Candidate: *I will do so, the Lord being my helper.*

Bishop: Will you be diligent in prayer and in reading the Holy Scriptures, and in such studies as help to the knowledge of the same, laying aside the study of the world and the flesh?

Candidate: *I will endeavor so to do, the Lord being my helper.*

Bishop: Will you be diligent to frame and fashion yourselves and your families according to the doctrine of Christ and to make both yourselves and them, as much as in you lies, wholesome examples and patterns to the flock of Christ?

Candidate: *I shall apply myself thereto, the Lord being my helper.*

Bishop: Will you maintain and set forth, as much as lies in you, sweetness, peace, and love among all Christian people, and especially among them that are of and shall be committed to your charge?

Candidate: *I will do so, the Lord being my helper.*

Bishop: Will you reverently obey your chief ministers unto whom is committed the charge and government over you, following with a glad mind and will their godly admonitions submitting yourselves to their godly judgments?

Candidate: *I will do so, the Lord being my helper.*

(After this, the congregation shall be required secretly in their prayers to make their humble supplications to God for all these things, for which prayers in silence shall be kept for a space.)

After which shall be said by the bishop (the persons to be ordained elders all kneeling), Veni Creator Spiritus (Latin: Come Creator Spirit), the bishop beginning and the elders standing and others that are present answering by verse as follows:

Bishop: Almighty God, who hath given you this will to do all things, grant also unto you strength and power to perform the same, that he may accomplish his work, which he hath begun, through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen

Bishop: Come Holy Ghost, our hearts inspire.

Response: *And lighten with celestial fire*

Bishop: Thou the anointing Spirit art,

Response: *Who doth thy sevenfold gift impart*

Bishop: Thy blessed unction from above.

Response: *Is comfort, light, and fire of love.*

Bishop: Enable with perpetual light

Response: *The dullness of our blinded sight;*

Bishop: Anoint and cheer our soiled face

Response: *With the abundance of thy grace.*

Bishop: Keep far our foes; give peace at home

Response: *Where thou art guide, no ill can come.*

Bishop: Teach us to know the Father, Son,

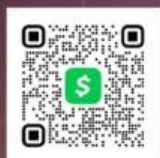
